

Use your own set of plates and screws or the ones delivered with your UTOPIA board



The "Narrow Wing Shape" allows a quick takeoff or rebound while dragging a minimum of water, it also allows tight jibes, bottom-turns and cut-backs without the risk of the back of the board catching on the water.
